

# January to May 2010

- 52,000 jobs added in Indiana
- One-fifth of the new jobs were added in manufacturing
- More overtime (average hours per week clocked more than 43 in fabricated metals)


## Indiana Job Gains

Indiana outpaced every state this month, with a percentage increase in jobs between January and May at nearly 2%

#### Hoosier production hours are up

- May: 42.6 January: 41.3
- 2.3 more hours per week in non-durables (from 38.7 to 41)
- 41.8 to 43.2 hours for fabricated metals (forging, stamping, bending, forming and machining)
